

2010 Jayhawk West Conference Runner Up Overall 40-17 KJCCC West 21-11

Garden City experienced another banner year in 2010. During the course of the season, the Busters experienced many highs. They reached the 40-win plateau for the second consecutive season, finishing with a 40-17 overall record. The 2010 regular season saw the team finish second in the KJCCC West, before loosing out in the championship game of the Cowley College Sub-Regional. The Busters started off with a 12-2 record and never looked back. Over the course of the season Garden City swept na-



tionally ranked #7 Yavapai College on the road and also

had wins against three other ranked programs. Garden City also spent a good portion of the season ranked in the national polls, reaching as high as 16th in the country.


The 2010 season saw many great individual performances and achievements. Garden City placed five players on All-Conference teams. Highlighting the award winners was sophomore Erik Mattingly

(Lakewood, CO). Erik experienced one of the most successful individual seasons in Buster history taking home 1st Team All-American honors, 1st Team All-Region, 1st Team All-Conference, while also being named the 2010 KJCCC West Player of the Year. Sophomores C.J. Gillman (Littleton, CO) and Reese McGraw (Boulder, CO) joined Mattingly on the All-Conference 1st Team, with McGraw also picking up 2nd

Team All-Region Honors. Freshman Axel Rivera (Yabucoa, PR) was tabbed second team All-Conference. Sophomore outfielder Andrew Phelan (Littleton, CO) was named Honorable Mention.



The Baseball Academy recently underwent a \$30,000 dollar renovation. The old lighting system was replaced with new High Efficiency T-5 Light Fixtures.




New heaters were placed the length of the Academy. New batting cage



2011 Season Preview

At the Junior College level, each spring brings about much change for baseball teams across the country. That will be the case for this year's Buster baseball team. The Busters head into this spring with only ten returning sophomores. These sophomores will look to lead a young group of twenty-three freshman into their first spring experience. "This is a young but talented team" said Head Coach Chris Finnegan. "Hopefully by the end of the year we've got them playing their best baseball. If we can accomplish that, this should be a fun group to watch".

Infield



The Busters welcome four new players in the middle infield. Seeing time at shortstop this spring will be freshmen Andrew Blackwell (Overland Park, KS) and Dakota Kell (Denver, O). Both players are athletic and talented and will look to build upon their fall season. At second base freshman Zach Baldini (Denver, CO) and Dietrick Turney (Brighton, CO) will battle it out. Both players are hungry and will look to make an impact this spring.

Seeing time at the hot corner will be freshman Shea Bell (Fort Collins, CO). Bell comes off a nice fall offensively and should be solid with the glove. Another freshman Brad Michaleski (Spruce Grove, Alberta) will see significant time at the hot corner. Brad also is coming off of a great fall with the bat and glove. Both of these players will help the team win games this spring.

Playing first base for the Busters will be the duo of sophomore Brad Benes (Omaha, NE) and freshman Scott Hoyt (Longmont, CO). Benes saw action in twenty-

five games last spring and had an onbase percentage of .544% while not committing a single error at first base. The coaching staff is expecting Brad to be a steadying influence on the young infield. Hoyt will see some time this spring at first base while he recovers from an arm injury suffered in high school. Scott was an all-state player in high school that the coaching staff is excited to watch this spring.



2011 Season Preview

Catchers

The Busters head into the spring with two talented freshmen behind the dish. Luke Flanagan (Centennial, CO) joins the Busters from Cherry Creek High School, which is one of the most successful high school programs in the country. Luke has a chance to make a big contribution this spring. Also looking to make a large contribution, both offensively and defensively, will be freshman Cody Kottich (Omaha, NE). Cody was a First Team All-State selection last year as a senior. Both players come off of successful fall seasons and look to continue their success this spring.

Outfield

New faces will be patrolling the outfield this spring at Williams Stadium. Sophomores Alex Kelly (Fort Collins, CO) and Sam Thornton (Canberra, ACT) moved from the infield to the outfield this fall. Both players easily made the transitions and will be counted on to make an impact this spring. Returning to the outfield is sophomore Blake Brisson (Omaha, NE). After seeing the majority of time in centerfield last spring, Blake will be counted on to play there again and hit at the top of the lineup. New comers Timmy Martinez (Brighton, CO) and Desmond Roberts (Omaha, NE) will be counted on to make impacts this spring. This year's group of outfielders are versatile and should give the coaching staff the flexibility it needs to put a quality group out there every game.



Pitchers

Pitching should be an area of strength this year for the Busters. The team has a talented group of newcomers to couple with a strong group of returning sophomores who saw significant action last year.

Returning to the mound this spring will be Alex Ellison (Littleton, CO). Ellison will be looked upon to anchor the staff after spending most of last season in the rotation as a freshman.

A trio of freshmen will be looking to lock up time on the mound as starters this spring. Todd Brazell (Peyton, CO), John Houston (O'Fallon, MO), and Desmond Roberts (Omaha, NE) all had nice falls and will look to build on that heading into this spring. Brazell and Roberts give the Busters some nice left-handed options while Houston has the chance to be an innings eater for the Busters.

Others who will see time as both starter and out of the pen are Kris Lalk (Denver, CO), Brennan Henry (Denver, CO), and Anthony Mastroni (Thornton, CO). The rest of the bullpen will be solid with Dillon Ayres (Wichita, KS), Matt Knotek (Fort Collins, CO), and Tyler Rogers (Littleton, CO), giving Finnegan a quality trio of relievers. Derek Krier (Salina, KS), Jake McFarland (Osage City, KS), Sam Thornton (Canberra, ACT), and Adam Warner (Canberra, ACT) will round out the pitching staff. All of these pitchers will be expected to throw quality innings this spring for the Busters.





Long respected as the leader in academics and athletics in the NJCAA, the conference today has grown to a membership of 19 community colleges from the state of Kansas, divided into two divisions, the East and West.





Chris Finnegan was named the head baseball coach at Garden City in October 2005 after serving one season as an assistant coach. Since taking over the helm Finnegan has led the Busters to an overall record of 177-113. Last year marked the second consecutive season with forty wins for Finnegan. In his 6 years as a Broncbuster coach Garden

City has thrived, winning 2 Jayhawk West Conference championships (2009 was the first outright title since 1989), finished Region VI Runner-Up twice, and hosted the first round of the Region VI championship 4 times advancing to Wichita each time to play for the Region VI title.

Coach Finnegan has also had the pleasure of coaching many great players. The Busters have had 34 All-Conference players, 8 All-region players, 3 All-Americans, 2 Freshmen of the Year, 2 Conference Players of the Year, and five Busters drafted under Chris while he also earned Coach of the Year Honors in 2009. Coach Finnegan's former players have moved on to schools such as Nebraska, Kansas, Charleston South-

ern, Creighton, Southeastern Louisiana, and many more highly regarded programs.

Coach Finnegan began his coaching career as an assistant at Peru State College, in Peru, Nebraska. He has also coached in the MINK League with the Chillicothe Mudcats and with the Mat Su Miners of the Alaskan League.

Finnegan, originally from Omaha, was drafted by the California Angels out of Millard North High School but opted to go to school. He began his college playing career at Hutchinson Community College. During 2005 as Assistant Coach the summer of 1998, Chris played for the Liberal Bee Jay's. Finnegan then transferred to the University of Southern Mississippi where he was a starting catcher for two seasons in Conference USA. During the summer of 1999, Finnegan played for the Hyannis Mets of the prestigious Cape Code League. After completing
